3. 16th Asso Bina Festival

March 3 is considered to be the turn of the season and is called "Hinamatsuri," a traditional event in Japan to pray for the healthy growth of girls. Families with girls display dolls called "Hina Dolls" and eat traditional Hinamatsuri dishes such as Chirashizushi and Hina Arare. Hina dolls are also called "Ohinasama.

In Tochigi City, from February 24 to March 5, hina dolls and coloring pictures of hina dolls made by kindergarten and nursery school children in the city will be displayed around the Kuranomachi Main Street, in the historical buildings in Kaemon-cho and around Uzuma River.

Please go out and see them.

4. Tochigi City Childbirth and Child-Raising Support Program

Starting in January, Tochigi City will implement a support program which provides consultation and financial support to pregnant women and families raising children so that they can give birth and raise children with peace of mind.

In the program, public health nurses and midwives will interview pregnant and nursing mothers and will visit their families around two months after birth. They will then provide support tailored to the individual circumstances of the expectant and nursing mothers.

A grant will be provided to pregnant women who have notified of their pregnancy and those who are caring for a child born in April 2022 or later.

Pregnant women will receive 50,000 yen as a gift after an interview is conducted at the time of pregnancy notification.

For those who are taking care of a newborn child, 50,000 yen per newborn will also be provided after an interview is conducted at households with infants..

The grant will be paid by bank transfer. Those who are eligible for the grant will be notified in mid-January or later. Please be sure to check the notification when you receive it.
